In particular three NH House Bills coming up for a vote soon deal with needy children's access to free and reduced lunch. One bill (since amended) proposes not requiring schools to provide lunch for half-time Kindergarten students. The other two bills deal with increasing children's access to free and reduced lunch and breakfast programs.
