
End 68 Hours of Hunger



An estimated 37,000 children in Hillsborough County are growing up in food-insecure households.



Hillsborough County has a 21.7% food insecurity rate, which is higher than the national average.



Several affluent neighborhoods in Tampa, such as South Tampa (zip code 33629) and Westchase (zip code 33615) where the average household income exceeds \$200,000, have pockets of poverty with children needing food assistance.



The dedicated volunteers of End 68 Hours of Hunger, contribute 500+ hours of service monthly to ensure that children in our community receive the food they need.

Summer is here, and thanks to all our volunteers, we've achieved something incredible.

You've probably heard the saying "It takes a village." At End 68 Hours of Hunger, that couldn't be more true. Our village starts with one central hub (a heartfelt thank-you to Hyde Park Presbyterian Church for donated space) and expands into our school communities—Bellamy, Mendenhall, Mitchell, Oak Park, and Plant. Together, we've delivered over 235,000 meals into the hands—and hearts—of children who would otherwise go hungry.

Just pause and imagine: hundreds of thousands of bags, cans, packets, pouches and snacks. The scale is staggering—and every item made a real difference in a child's life.

This year, we supported over 300 families, from single-child households to families with nine children. Each one felt the impact of your generosity.

Behind this success is a dedicated army of volunteers—over 150 people strong. Some show up weekly, others bi-weekly or monthly, but all give their time with purpose and love. CELEBRATING 10 YEARS OF NOURISHING SUCCESS

Good nutrition is essential for a child's success, playing a crucial role in brain development, memory, and behavior. Adequately nourished children are ready to learn, grow, and thrive — in school and beyond.

One person, Carol LoCicero, was inspired to make a difference. Thanks to her vision, we are now celebrating the completion of our 10th year helping children in our community.

Our journey began with 1 school and 9 families at Grady Elementary in 2014–2015. By January 2016, we were assisting 42 children across 6 schools. By 2017–2018, we were supporting 97 students in 14 schools. Our impact grew further. In 2020–2021, we aided 238 families and 680 children. By 2022–2023, our program extended to 36 schools.

And this year? We reached nearly 900 students in 35 schools, delivering over 235,000 meals — providing the nourishment that helps every child achieve their potential.

Your partnership makes this possible. Together, we are fighting hunger, fostering learning, and transforming futures — one meal at a time.
